Lock Your Doors and Windows

Keep Your Property Well-Lit

Criminals are far less likely to operate under a giant spotlight as they break your house's window. Use of motion-sensing lights can surprise and even deter intruders. You can also invest in switches indoors that will put your lights on a timer or controlled by a smart app to make it seem as if someone's home even when you're out of the house.

Press Pause on Your Posting

Posting about your vacation on social media is akin to rolling out the red carpet for thieves looking for vacant homes to rob. If your profile is public, anyone can find your socials and see you won't be home. From there, all they have to do is pick a time and help themselves to your valuables.

Don't Leave Delivery Boxes in Plain Sight

Consider having valuable packages delivered to a location with people or requiring delivery. You can also ask for packages to be left on the back door so they are not visible from the street.

Protect Your Outdoor Valuables

Consider securing your grill, lawnmower, bicycles, etc. Cable locks used on bicycles may be sufficient deterrent to cause thieves to look elsewhere.
